The Tijuana Transition Program



The magine you are eighteen years old again. You have just left your childhood home with all your belongings in one suitcase. You have some money for food, but certainly not enough for rent. You had a job but were fired for showing up late. Day labor in a factory, berry field, or outdoor market is the only job you can keep. You graduated high school but are not

applying for college. You don't have money for college, so why bother? You're not asking your family for help. They are too unstable, unwilling, or unable to help. Friends and siblings aside, you feel totally alone. If this were you, how would you fare?

The kids leaving our homes in Baja, Oaxaca,

and Tijuana would be in a similarly perilous situation – if not for the support of our Tijuana program. Today, while our program looks slightly different than it has in the past, our heart is the same. We want to walk with our young adults as they transition to healthy Christ-centered adult lives with financial stability, safe housing, and healthy family and community relationships.

Instead of one large house, our 15 young adults live in six different apartments, allowing them to practice independent life – cooking, budgeting for groceries and personal expenses, navigating roommate conflicts – all while FFHM guidance and supervision. Most of our young adults live in a building owned and managed by FFHM, but two older boys have "graduated" to an even more independent life in an apartment off-site. All our youth are working towards a goal. For most, it's graduating college or tech school. During this process, our kids are discipled, mentored, and loved during each step. Transitioning into adulthood is hard, but through it all, we want our kids to know that they are resilient, that God is good, and that they are never alone. We are grateful to each donor who makes this possible for these young adults.

Penny is a bright student and a hard worker. She arrived in Tijuana from Oaxaca in October of 2021. She was separated from her sister for the first time and was afraid to leave the house alone. Knowing Tijuana's reputation, she expected the people

in Tijuana to be rude or dangerous. She didn't let her fear stop her and was surprised by the many kind people she has met in school and work. While she still misses her sister, Jenny has met many new friends and can navigate the city to get to class or work at her part-time job. In fact, one of Jenny's favorite things about Tijuana is the many kind people she meets in the city, and she is proud of the fact that she can do things for herself, like joining a gym or going shopping.
